





The Suffolk House was built in the 1780s on a vast estate owned by the founder of Penang (then Prince of Wales Island), Captain Francis Light. Considered the first "Great house of Penang", the Suffolk House was named after Light's birthplace, Suffolk, England. The unique mansion features authentic Anglo-Indian architecture, which earned it a special ecognition from UNESCO. The structure has gone through many stages of storation spanning over 40 years. Today, part of the mansion has been converted

WATERFALL HILLTOP TEMPLE

Dedicated to the deity Murugan, the Balathandayuthapani Temple is one of the oldest Hindu temples in Penang. Originally, it was located within the Botanic Gardens but was later moved to its present hilltop location at the beginning of the 20th century. The temple is the last destination for the annual Thaipusam festival.



10 FLOATING MOSQUE

Malaysia's first floating mosque at the sea is located along the scenic stretch of Tanjung Bunga. Accommodating up to 1,500 worshippers, the mosque features a blend of local and Middle Eastern architecture with a seven-storey minaret. There is an open space for visitors to sea gaze peacefully.



BATU FERINGGI (refer to Batu Feringgi map)

The garden is a picturesque oasis, home to over 500 exotic varieties of plants. Its undulating landscaped trails invite visitors o go on a mesmerising, refreshing






